☐ Aviation in Canada: The CAE Story. Milberry. Full-out effort covering one of the world's great aerospace manufacturers and likely the finest aerospace company history ever printed. Begun in 1947. CAE edges into flight simulation with the CF-100. CAE survives this near disaster to pioneer with Argus & CF-104 "flight sims", then does its first commercial products (DC-9s). In the 1950-70s CAE tackles anything from Arctic defence to consumer products. It operates Mid Canada Line stations, overhauls C-119s, F-84s, T-33s, T-39s and Viscounts, manufactures L-1011 structural parts, runs a forest industry business, fails with road graders and bushplanes, pumps out auto parts, designs control systems for power stations and naval vessels, buys (then sells) its biggest competitor, Link. In the 70s CAE designs the robotic hand controllers for the Canadarm orbiting today on the ISS.

This world-class book brings you to 2015, by when CAE had the lion's share of the commercial flight simulator market, had developed advanced visual and motion systems, and had flying schools and flight simulation centres, helping to ease the worldwide pilot shortage. - The Captain's Widow Superb new bio. Shirley Hiebert recounts her journey growing up Mennonite in Manitoba farm country & inner-city Winnipeg. It's no exaggeration to call her survival a miracle. Once she marries a northern pilot (DC-3, 748, etc.), life looks up. After he dies in a dreadful crash, she builds her own connections up north, becomes a Nurse Practitioner, wins her PhD (a huge deal for a Mennonite) and becomes a pilot. She flies solo to the site of the awful crash & takes on Ottawa over the facts swirling around it. Don't miss this gem. 324pp, sc. photos, map, app'x, biblio. \$24.50 B

Earning his wings, he proceeds to gunnery school, then Chatham for the Sabre course. Here you meet all those fabulous heroes you know from The Canadair Sabre and Canada's Air Force at War and Peace - the likes of Stan Turner, Johnny Buzza, Ernie Glover, Bruce Fleming, Larry Spurr, Tommy Wheeler and Omer Levesque. Gord sets the tone about life at "the OTU" Next he joins 422 Sqn and goes over-seas on "Leapfrog IV". He gets into all the details of Canada's role in NATO vs the USSR. You more than get your money's worth by the detailed way Gord walks us through this era. He has his first big excitement (ejecting), but RCAF training gets him through. Everything you need to know about the RCAF Sabre era is beautifully covered. All the rest is equally fantastic. He instructs out west and survives yet another prang, then covers his non-flying postings. One the very best so far of such RCAF memoirs, a book you'll treasure. \$20.00 B

- ☐ J.P. Bickell: The Life, the Leafs and the Legacy New bio of this great Canadian who made his first fortune in grain c.1900, then went into mining, eventually building McIntyre into Canada's leading gold miner.

- Along the way he acquired to Toronto Maple Leafs. However, his role in aviation is outstanding, whether his pioneering in corporate aviation (Stinson Reliant, Grumman Goose, etc.), wartime aircraft production in the UK alongside Lord Beaverbrook, his leadership in building Lancasters at Malton, then his backing of Avro Canada beginning in 1945. - □ Bagotville: 75 Years of Air Defence Marc-Andre Valiquette has done his usual in-depth work in assembling the exciting history of one of the great RCAF air stations. He blends in both languages in his attractive and seamless layout. His huge book begins in WWII with Bagotville training fighter pilots on Harvards and Hurricanes. Famous aces pass through instructing, many students go on to stellar careers. Next, is the postwar era with Vampires, Sabres and CF-100s – all the historic squadrons, especially the all-weather CF-100 units - 440 and 432. Developments are steady - 440 goes overseas, 413 forms, there's a stream of air defence exercises, etc. The CF-100 gives way to the CF-101 Voodoo (410 and 425), then the tactical world arrives with the CF-5 (433). Finally come the CF-18 Hornet years for 425 Squad-ron, then 433. Base Flight/439 Sqn is included – from T-33 to Griffon. - ☐ Exile Air: World War II's Little Norway in Toronto and Muskoka Andrea Baston spent years researching this epic history. Begins with an outline of Germany's 1940 invasion of Norway. How Norway and the UK struggled to avert disaster, RNoAF 1920s Fokkers and RAF Gladiators putting up a strenuous defence. With Norway's government in exile, a Norwegian air training plan ("Little Norway") is established at Toronto Island Airport. All the details from growing pains to training, housing, contracts, administration, accidents, sports, social life. Little Norway adds a base in Muskoka, where pilots train on Cornells.
